## **AIVP Days in Venice (Italy), 16, 17 and 18 November 2023**

The Board of Directors of AIVP, meeting on the 21<sup>st</sup> October 2022 in Le Havre, under the chairmanship of Mr Edouard Philippe, unanimously approved the bid of the port city of Venice (Italy) to host the AIVP Days 2023. This major annual meeting of AIVP will enable many exchanges and debates to take place around the challenges of the sustainable port city, as presented in the AIVP Agenda 2030. Venice today has the ambition to become one of the world references in terms of sustainability.

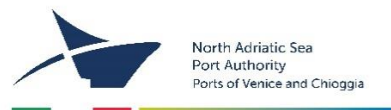
