Issues

Adapting the governance of the AIVP to the creation of a new company Permanent Representations in various countries around the world

Proposal

Introducing a principle of reciprocity between the governance bodies of the Permanent Representation and those of the AIVP



Statutary amendment : new article 22 about Permanent Representative Offices

Roles of the permanent representative offices:

To realize the association's purpose within the geographical remit concerned;

to increase in the association's membership within the geographical area concerned;

- to deploy specific annual programmes of action taking account of local characteristics specific to the geographical area concerned;
- to offer and deploy the member benefits developed by the association.

Accreditation of permanent representative offices:

Each permanent representative office must be pre-accredited by the association's General Meeting on the recommendation of the Board of Directors, after first having heard the candidates proposing to found the permanent representative office concerned.:



Statutary amendment: new article 22 about Permanent Representative Offices

Status of permanent representative offices:

Each permanent representative office must be a non-profit organization.

The AIVP Board of Directors appoints a member to represent it on all the bodies of a Permanent Representative Office

Each permanent representative office must appoint a representative to sit ex officio on the AIVP Board of Directors.

Each permanent representative office shall employ and cover the costs of such staff as it may require in order to operate correctly, in a manner commensurate with its financial resources.

What is the Agenda 2030 by AIVP?





The document, produced jointly with AIVP members at the Quebec Conference in 2018, sets down 10 goals to be achieved by 2030.

It was submitted to the UN in 2019 as the contribution of port cities to the 17 Sustainable Development Goals, within the framework of the partnership initiated with this international institution.


Ratifying the Agenda 2030 by AIVP Up to 80 signatories since 2018





Accessibility of the Cruise Terminal in Istanbul

Regarding the cruise terminal, an interesting point to consider is the accessibility of the quays outside of cruise days. A very interesting example of cruise terminal quay accessibility is <u>Galataport</u> in Istanbul (Turkey). This terminal is located on the Golden Horn, which is the historic part of the European side of the city of Istanbul. It is close to heritage sites. It is now close to the new museum Istanbul Modern, which has been designed by the famous architect Renzo Piano, directly on the waterfront.

The cruise terminal extends itself on 1,2km of shoreside. It was built underground with access through panels that can close or open the area to the <code>gengral.public</code>. This means that when a cruise ship is moored the area is not accessible because the panels are lifted, and when there is no ship, the area is a completely open and accessible space. This terminal was a very costly operation but a similar solution to the panel can be interesting to consider to both respect international regulation while providing access to the waterfront to citizens when the terminal is not in operation.

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
