Tall Ships Races Bordeaux 2027

Tall Ships is Europe's largest free family event

Bordeaux, France

1 million people expected

From July 7 to 11, 2027, Bordeaux Métropole will host the first leg of the Tall Ships Races 2027, a famous international race for tall ship training vessels, organized by the Sail Training International association.

For this occasion, some **forty exceptional sailboats** from around the world will stop at the Port de la Lune, in the heart of downtown Bordeaux and the Bassins à Flots, for **five days of festivities** and free activities open to all, centered around maritime and wine heritage, and the spirit of the sea.

For this exceptional nautical event, Bordeaux Wine Festival will join the festivities to create a single event at the intersection of wine and sea cultures.

Bordeaux, UNESCO World Heritage

Bordeaux is known worldwide for its vineyards, its gastronomy, and its art of living. But with its rich history, it is also renowned for its historical heritage and will surprise you with its modernity and contemporary architectural works.

The Port de la Lune is an exceptional example of an exchange of influences spanning more than 2,000 years, through its role as the capital of a world-renowned wine region, and the importance of its port in regional and international trade.

It is the recognition of the value and unity of its 18th century heritage that earned it inclusion in 2007 on the prestigious **UNESCO World Heritage** List. Furthermore, in 2022, Bordeaux was crowned **European Capital of Smart Tourism**.

From le Verdon-sur-Mer, a **true deep-water port** that can accommodate ships of any size, to Bordeaux Port de la Lune and its **exceptional historical heritage**, the port of Bordeaux offers varied and complementary reception possibilities for all types of ships.

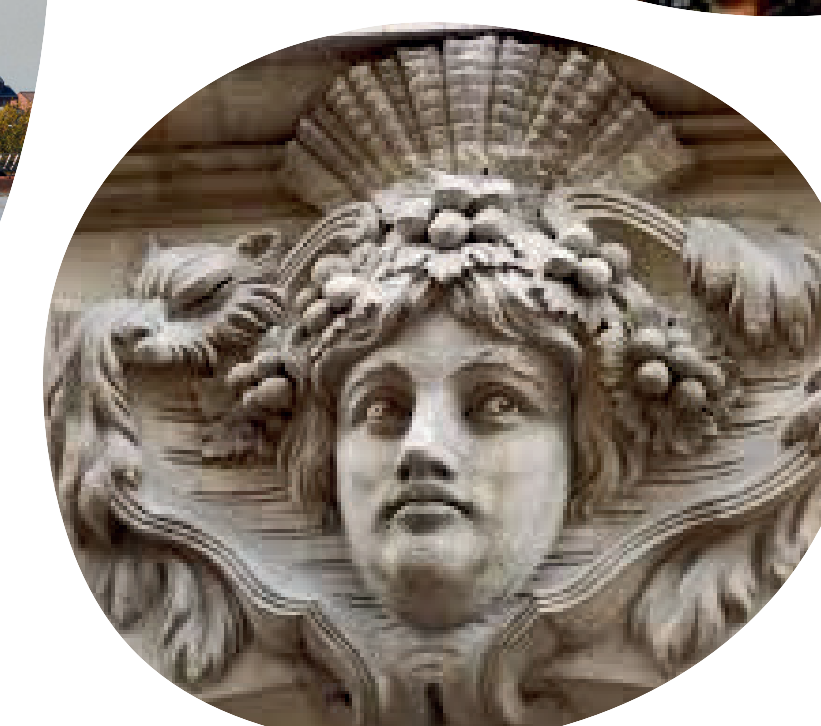
Bordeaux industrial port complex creates 8,620 jobs (2022 figures), spread across nearly 232 companies. It covers 95% of the energy needs of the southwest region of France and has a vast land area of 2,500 hectares, offering numerous opportunities for industrial and logistical development.

Maritime cruises at the port of Bordeaux in 2024 :

- 5 berths
- 67,000 passengers
- 3 cruise terminals: Bordeaux, Pauillac, and le Verdon
- 64 calls across all cruise terminals in the Port of Bordeaux

Bordeaux Center Terminal

Also known as the "**Port of the Moon**", the Bordeaux terminal can accommodate cruise ships of less than 255 m at two berths, offering cruise passengers the opportunity to stop in the historic city centre, in the heart of UNESCO's world heritage site.
